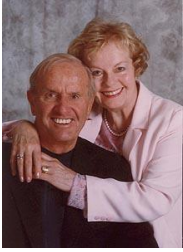


A SENIOR TESTIMONY

A few months later, Home Depot called me to help open its paint department in a new store. They hired me because of my contractor experience 30 years ago.

Anne, who was an experienced real estate agent in California, earned her license in Nevada and eventually ended up with a 4-year contract with Warmington Homes. Home depot let me go after one year. They said I was an excellent salesman, but I did not fit into the corporate culture. No kidding, I knew that!



August 2003, I received the most important phone call of my life. Bob Schmidt asked me to meet Sherman in Vegas.
